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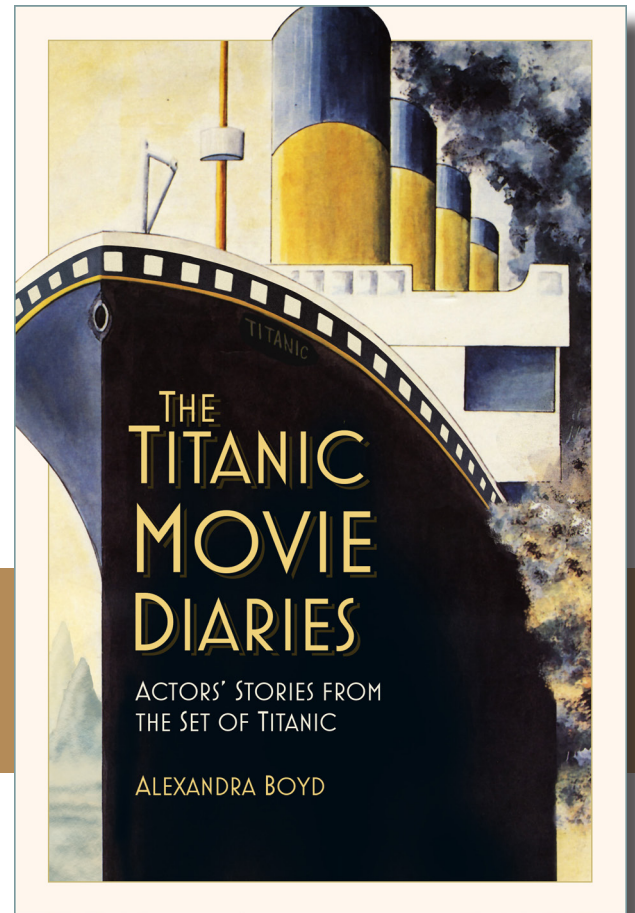

Her first feature (*Widow's Walk*) won Best Cinematography at the Chelsea Film Festival in New York. Her latest film project is the documentary *Ship of Dreams: Titanic Movie Diaries*. She co-hosts **TITANIC TALK** podcast with journalist and author **Nelson Aspen**; now in its fourth season, it has 70+ episodes.
